

"JINKE BINA ZINDAGI ANJAN HAI"


The event took place as a fascinating journey, leaving an indelible mark in the hearts.

DAYLIGHT DELIGHTS



He defined biomimicry as the practice of finding sustainable solutions by imitating nature's strategies. He linked biomimicry to daily life and business challenges through real-world examples. The session emphasized significance of asking the right questions when applying biomimicry to problem-solving. It encouraged participants to observe and understand nature's principles.

And may my last touch be your face.


May our love forever intertwine


